

Play "leak detective" with your kids—finding and **fixing drips in your home**—or chase down leaks yourself. Place a few drops of food coloring into the tank at the back of your toilet and wait a few minutes. If the color shows up in the toilet bowl, you have a leak! Most commonly, toilet leaks are caused by a worn flapper. Toilet flappers are inexpensive and simple to replace.

Wait for a full load of laundry before running the washing machine.

Same goes for the dishwasher: let it do the work for you—running a full dishwasher uses less water than washing by hand.


To save even more water, **try scraping leftover** food into the trash rather than rinsing before loading dishes into the dishwasher.



YELLOW FLAGS: NATURAL GAS, OIL, STEAM, OR PROPANE.

**ORANGE FLAGS: COMMUNICATION CABLES.** 

**BLUE FLAGS: WATER.** 

PURPLE FLAGS: RECLAIMED WATER, IRRIGATION.

**GREEN FLAGS: SEWER.** 

WHITE FLAGS: AREA OF PROPOSED EXCAVATION

#### **Use Caution Around Electric** Meters, Poles and Equipment

- Never try to prune trees that appear to **be growing into power lines.** Contact New Ulm Public Utilities as we have skilled professionals trained to safely prune and trim trees for electric line clearances.
- Don't post fliers or posters on electric **poles.** It is illegal to do so. Damage to the poles can create a dangerous situation and can cause outages. Posters, nails, and staples can make it dangerous or impossible for linemen to climb the poles if needed, and protruding nails are a danger for anyone who needs to remove the poles.
- When landscaping, plant tall-growing trees safely away from power lines. Seek help in choosing and planting trees and bushes that will not grow to interfere with electrical equipment.
- Do not plant near underground utility **services.** Tree roots can grow and interfere with underground wire, pipes, and cables. Future repairs to these facilities also could damage the health and beauty of nearby plants and trees.
- Clean up. Keep areas around electric meters, transformers, or other electrical equipment free of any vegetation that could limit utility service access.

## A/C Check and **Clean Rebate**

Receive a rebate of \$40 as a utility bill credit when you get an air conditioner check and clean from a participating vendor. Submit an application (found on newulmmn.gov) along with your invoice.

## **Air Conditioner Rebates**

Receive between \$100 to \$320 electrical rebate for central air conditioner /minisplit AC systems, depending on SEER (Seasonal Efficiency **Energy Rating).** Efficiency Requirement is a minimum SEER of 14.5 and

must be AHRI Certified.



#### **Efficient lawn watering:**

- · Water landscapes and lawns during the early morning when it is still cool.
- · Lawns need about 1 inch of rain or water per week. Deep soaking is better for roots than frequent shallow watering.
- · Water your lawn infrequently, one time or less per week, assuming no rainfall has occurred.






