Frequently Asked Questions

What is a foot scooter?

A foot scooter is a device with handlebars designed to sit or stand on that has either

- (a) no more than two ten-inch or smaller diameter wheels or
- (b) an engine or motor that is capable of a maximum speed of 15 miles per hour.

What are the foot scooter laws and regulations?

The following laws and regulations are now in effect:

- The minimum age to operate a foot scooter is 12 years old
- All riders under the age of 18 are required to wear a helmet
- There cannot be more than one person on the scooter at a time
- Foot scooters are not allowed on sidewalks, unless necessary to enter or leave adjacent property
- Scooters must ride as close to the right side of the street or curb as possible and walk the foot scooter across the road when making a left turn
- Scooters may operate on a bicycle path, lane, trail or bikeway that is not reserved for the exclusive use of non-motorized traffic
- If operated after dusk, foot scooters must have a headlight and taillight
- No license or license plates are required for foot scooters

All of the above laws and regulations are enforced by the New Ulm Police Department. Violators can be ticketed or fined.

What is not considered a foot scooter?

There has been some confusion about what is or is not considered a foot scooter. The following are NOT considered foot scooters:

- Electric personal assistive mobility device
- A motorized bicycle
- An electric-assisted bicycle
- A motorcycle is not a motorized foot scooter

Because these are not considered foot scooters, different laws apply to their use than those detailed above.

Motorized Foot Scooter (Gas)

- Legal on local streets
 (as of Aug. 1, 2005)
 SS 169.225
- Minimum age is 12 & ages 12 to 17 must
 wear a helmet
- Under 15 mph
- Right side of roadway & must walk across the road for a left turn
 - Illegal on sidewalks & parks

Motorized Foot Scooter (Electric)



- Electric Scooters are legal on local streets (as of Aug. 1, 2005) SS 169.225
- Minimum age is 12
 & ages 12 to 17
 must wear a helmet
 - Under 15 mph
 - Right side of roadway & must walk across the

road for a left turn

 Prohibited on sidewalks and in parks SS 169.225

Power Boards or Dirt Surfers



- Gas or Electric Powered
 - 22 to 30 mph
- No light or safety features
- Defined as a Recreational Vehicle and prohibited on roads, sidewalks & in parks

Go Karts



- Gas powered
- No safety lighting or signals
 - 5 hp motors
 - Speeds to 25 mph

Illegal on streets and in parks

Mini Motorcycles (Pocket Bikes)



- 50 to 80 cc engines
- Speeds up to 35 mph
 - Off-road use only
- Prohibited on streets, sidewalks & in parks

Mopeds





- Can be street legal
 - Up to 30 mph
- Can be licensed and drivers issued moped permits
 - Has safety features
 - Are not Recreational Vehicles have transportation aspect

• Drivers need to follow traffic laws

Motorized Bicycles



- Legal not Recreational Vehicles
- Have pedals and can be self-propelled
 - Two tandem wheels
 - Motor less than 50 cc
 - Maximum speed 30 mph
 - Allowed on streets
 - Prohibited on sidewalks or in parks

• License or permit required

Segways: Personal Assistive Mobility Devices



- Legal on sidewalks and in parks
- Under some circumstances, can be on the streets (SS 169.212)

Mobility Scooters - Disability Needs



• Legal - not a Recreational Vehicle

City Ordinance Recreational / Off-Road Vehicles

- For use on private property with permission
- No use on school property, parks or playgrounds
- Prohibited on sidewalks, pedestrian trails or walkways
 - Prohibited on streets or highways (unless licensed or are scooters)
 - Review other prohibitions
