FREE GAS APPLIANCE INSPECTION

When you experience a problem with the operation of a gas appliance, call the Gas Department first at 507-359-8264 during work hours or 877-868-3636 anytime. We will send a service technician to make sure the problem is not with the gas supply at no charge to you.

After the technician has checked the gas meter and regulator for proper operation it may be necessary to contact a qualified repair person to service your appliance. We do not make any adjustments or repairs.

If you call an appliance repair person or plumber before calling us and the problem turns out to be the gas meter or regulator you will not be reimbursed for the appliance service call.

CLEAN ENERGY TAX **CREDITS**

Who is eligible for tax credits? Homeowners, including renters for certain expenditures, who purchase energy and other efficient appliances and products.

What do consumers do to get the credit(s)?

Fill out IRS Form 5695, following IRS instructions, and include it when filing your tax return. Include any relevant product receipts.

How much credit is given?

30% of cost of item (with a varying cap depending upon item). Items included are:

- Home Clean Electricity Products
- Heating, Cooling, and Water Heating
- Energy Efficiency Upgrades including windows, doors, electrical upgrades, insulation materials, home energy audits.

Heat oven to 250°. Melt butter in a shallow pan over low heat. Stir in Worcestershire sauce and seasoned salt. Add all the rest. Mix over low heat until all the pieces are coated. Heat in oven for 45 minutes, stirring every 15 minutes. Spread out on absorbent paper to cool. Yield: 6 3/4 cups.

Dumplings

Roll dough into dumplings (about the size of a racquetball).





A FEW METER FACTS

- Tampering with a meter is illegal in most
- Meters should only be installed, maintained or removed by electric utility
- Accessing the backside of a meter could generate high voltage.
- Serious injury or death from electrocution, explosion or fire is often a result of meter tampering.
- Electricity should always be connected or disconnected using a transfer switch or dedicated disconnection point.
- There is no guarantee that a structure will be deenergized by pulling a meter.

INSPECT HEATING SYSTEM:

- Have your heating system professionally serviced.
- Replace air filters if needed.
- Ensure vents and radiators are unblocked for efficient heat distribution.

TEST AND MAINTAIN SMOKE AND CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS:

- Replace batteries in smoke and carbon monoxide detectors.
- Test detectors to ensure they function properly.

PREPARE PIPES AND WATER SUPPLY:

- Insulate exposed pipes to prevent freezing.
- Drain and shut off outdoor faucets and irrigation systems.
- Know the location of water shut-off valve in case of emergency.

PREPARE YOUR HOME'S EXTERIOR:

- Clear gutters and downspouts to prevent ice dams.
- Trim trees away from the house to avoid damage.
- Ensure downspouts extend away from the foundation.
- Service and store equipment such as lawnmowers and trimmers.
- Gather winter tools such as snow shovels and ice melt.

INCREASE HOME ENERGY EFFICIENCY:

- Seal gaps at windows and doors with weatherstripping or caulk.
- Set ceiling fans to rotate clockwise to circulate warm air.
- Lower your thermostat a few degrees to save on heating costs.

Ingredients for Saving Energy and \$

- Have a heating system checkup and **change** your filter every month or two during winter.
- Check for gaps and air leaks around doors, windows, outlets, etc. Seal these areas with caulk, sealant, weather stripping, etc.
- Use a **programmable thermostat** to set your temperature lower when you're away to save about \$180 each year.
- Leave space around heating registers so warm air can easily enter the area.
- Consider replacing older heating equipment with newer, more efficient systems.
- Keep curtains open to let direct sunlight heat the home during daylight hours. Close your curtains in the evening to reduce drafts.
- Turn your water heater down to about 120 degrees. Water heating consumes nearly a fifth of heating costs.
