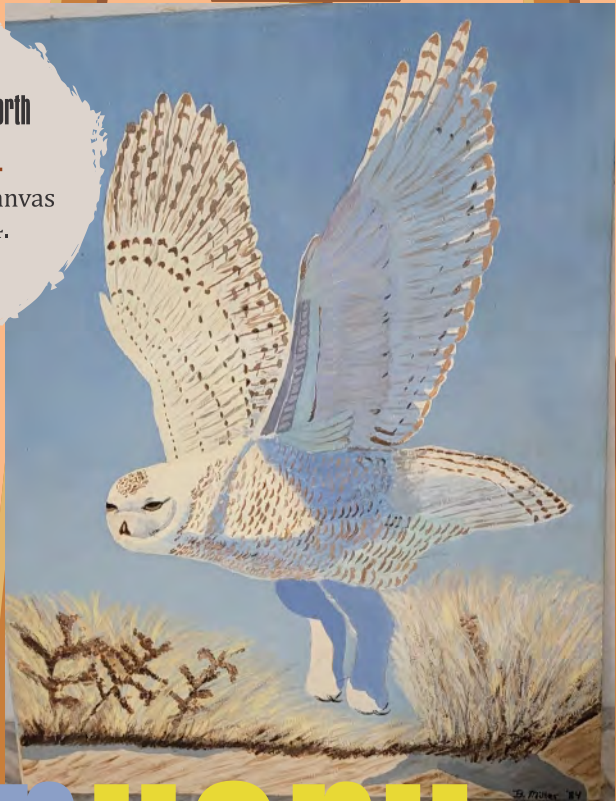

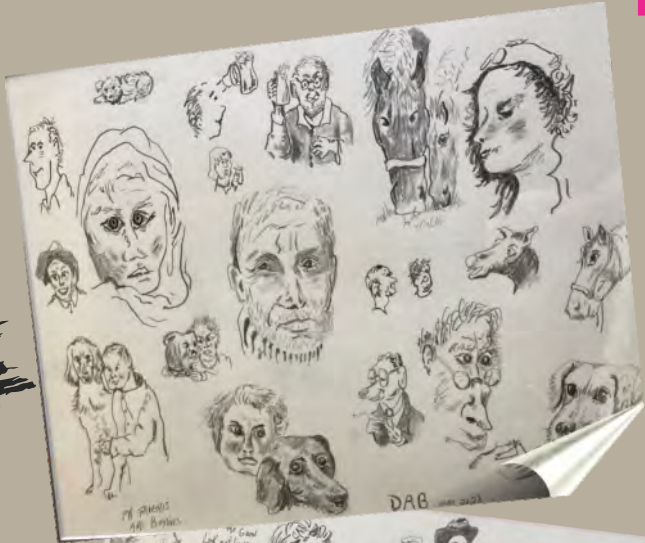

Brush up on...

LEAD AND DRINKING WATER SAFETY

New Ulm's drinking water is clean and safe to drink when it leaves NUPU Water Treatment Plant, but lead can dissolve from service lines, household plumbing materials, and faucets that contain lead once it reaches homeowners. To control lead in water mains, NUPU treats the water with a compound that forms a protective coating inside pipes. We have provided this corrosion control since 1989.

What you can do:

- Replace all lead plumbing components. Lead solder, lead piping, and brass fixtures that contain lead could be part of your private plumbing. A licensed plumber can help.
- Never use water from the hot water tap for cooking or mixing baby formula. Hot water causes higher amounts of lead to be released from plumbing materials. Instead, heat cold water.
- Use water filters that attach to the faucet, or in a pitcher that are certified for lead removal.
- Regularly remove and clean faucet aerators. Sediment and lead particles can be trapped by the screen on the end of faucets.

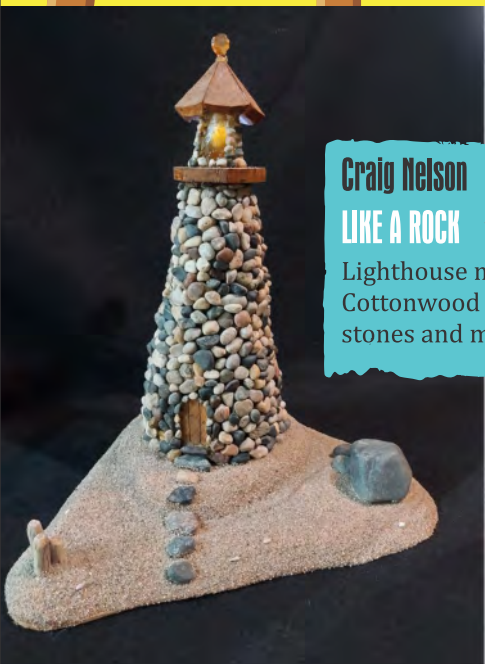

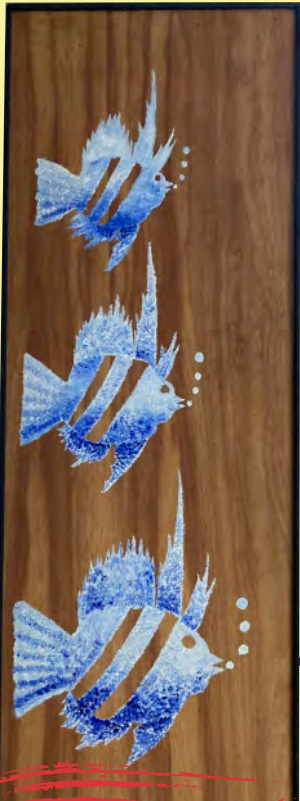

SUMMER SAFETY

STORM SAFETY

Storm debris can hide dangers, such as downed or sagging power lines. Use caution in any cleanup effort. Any downed wires should be considered energized and potentially dangerous. Stay away, warn others to stay away, and call the utility.

DON'T RELEASE BALLOONS

Balloons, especially metallic coated balloons, can cause explosions and power outages and can short out circuits in the community's power system causing untold dollars' worth of damage. Plus they can harm wildlife.

EFFICIENT LAWN WATERING

Water landscapes and lawns during the early morning when it is still cool. Lawns need about 1 inch of rain or water per week. Deep soaking is better for roots than frequent shallow watering. Water your lawn infrequently, one time or less per week, assuming no rainfall has occurred. Cut grass 3 to 4 inches.

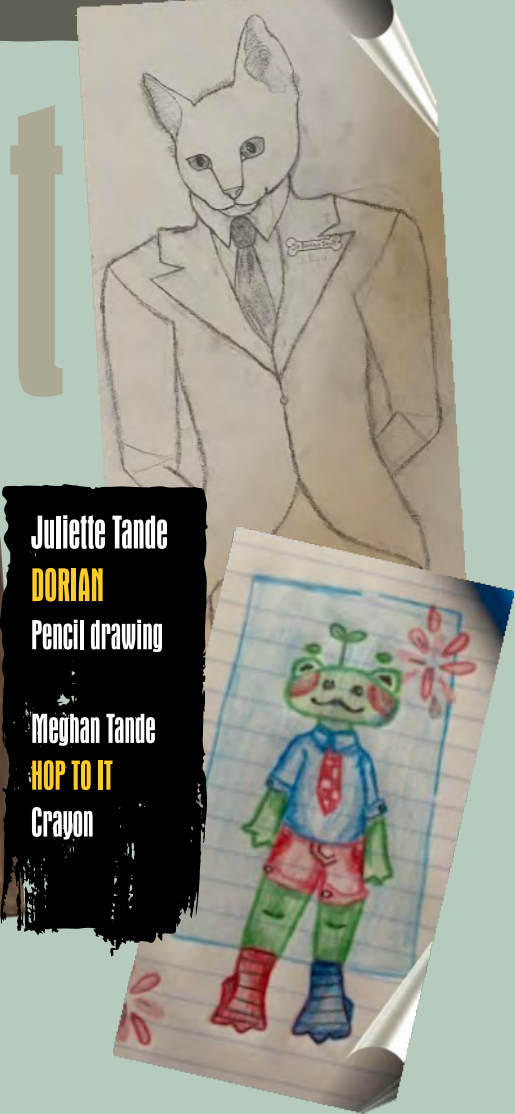

CARBON MONOXIDE

SAFETY TIPS

- 1) Have your furnace cleaned and checked, including chimneys and vents, by a qualified service technician.
- 2) Install a carbon monoxide detector in your home near your bedroom.
- 3) If you need to warm a vehicle, remove it from the garage immediately after starting it. Do not run a vehicle or other fueled engine or motor indoors, even if garage doors are open. Make sure the exhaust pipe of a running vehicle is not covered with snow.
- 4) During and after a snowfall, make sure vents for the dryer, furnace, stove, and fireplace are clear of snow build-up.
- 5) Gas or charcoal grills, kerosene heaters, and generators can produce CO — only use outside.
- 6) Never use a gas range or oven for heating.

If the CO alarm sounds, immediately move to a fresh air location and call New Ulm Public Utilities Gas Department.

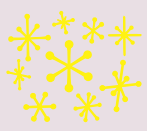
